Compliance: Define and Give 3 Examples

- **Data Protection Legislation** – Numerous EU Directives – possibly American/Asian also important
- **Basel II** – Bank for International Settlements Basel committee – minimum capital requirements, supervision, and market discipline to align capital with risk
- **Freedom of Information Act** – UK – Right of access to all printed information of public authorities – production of a guide to information and ability to handle individual requests – other countries have their versions
- **IAS** – International Accounting Standard for financial statements for recognition and measurement, and consolidation and reporting
- **ISO 15489** – requirements for structuring records management practice – global benchmark for records management
- **DOMEA** (Document Management and Electronic Archiving in IT) – German government information management requirement – has 250+ requirements
- **BSI PD0008** – British Standards Institute code of practice for “Legal Admissibility and Evidential Weight of Information Stored Electronically”
- **eEurope 2005** – (Basta così!!)

What are the Implications of Regulatory Compliance?



- Compliance affects the entire organization
- Drives efficiency and integration (hmmm, sounds like an on demand business)
- Is an ongoing issue – not a one-time purchase (on demand again!)
- This is a politically-charged issue, especially in the EU
- + Recent IBM study – 78% of respondents in financial services think this is important or critical to their business from a STORAGE viewpoint
- + Going to spend lots and lots of euros/pounds on this stuff!!!!
- Recent Economist Intelligence Unit report shows only 27% of senior executives ask for input from IT departments when planning major deployments
- Non-compliant companies severely punished and look bad

The Pain of Non-Compliance

- Abbey National fined £2,320,000 by FSA anti-money laundering procedures and reporting of SARs (suspicious activity reports)
- HBOS fined £1,250,000 by FSA for customer identification records regarding anti-money laundering
- Deloitte & Touche fined £750,000 by FSA in part for not keeping proper records
- 5 US Financial Services firms fined \$1,650,000 each (\$8.25mn cumulative) for failing to preserve internal e-mail
- Broadway National Bank fined \$4,000,000 for failing to establish an anti-money laundering policy

What are the Implications of Data Retention?

- SEC (US) has regulations on what's acceptable:
 - Non-rewriteable, non-erasable
 - WORM technologies like optical media, magnetic disk, some tape
 - Time stamped
 - Copies stored in separate locations
- Financial Services Modernization Act (US)
 - Encryption
 - Authentication
 - Access control,
 - Standard safeguards: regular backups and secure storage

Political Reaction to Data Retention

- Electronic Privacy Information Center (EPIC) - keeps track of EU and member country issues
- Statewatch – monitors the state and civil liberties in the EU
- Foundation for Information Policy Research (FIPR) – studies interaction between IT and society

Customer Pain Points

- Change management is difficult
- Departments are silo-ed
- Systems aren't integrated
- No clear vision of truth



- *Note: Need to differentiate between Fibre Channel and Serial ATA **NOT** Really important at this point!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!*
- *ROI not as important here either!*

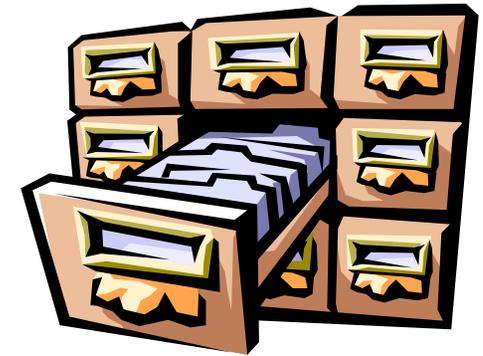

- Vertical applications



Business Partner Opportunities

- BIG NEWS – What an opportunity!
- Who do you talk to? CIO? Head of Compliance? Business Managers? Marketing Manager? Risk Manager? Data Controllers? Information Security Managers? – massive range of players, so you may not have worked with previously

Implications for Storage Sales
